2009 Proposals

Proposals

1. +45 Proposal: Identify the specific provision that will be changed:

Amends Art. III., Sec. 1

State the language of the proposal: Add Paragraph (d) a player older than forty-five (45) years old, not subject to a gender adjustment, may request an age adjustment from the Commissioner to allow the player's team to play with 8.5 points while the player is on the court.

State the reason the proposal should be passed: Makes the resolution passed in 2007 permanent.

2. College Proposition: Identify the specific provision that will be changed: Ads Art. III., Sec. 3(f)(ii)

State the language of the proposal: A player who transfers to a higher ranked team may defer ineligibility to play in postseason play for five seasons provided that (1) the player is a full time student athlete and (2) the team is part of a full time academic institution. For purposes of this Bylaw, a full time student athlete is defined as an undergraduate or graduate student who would be eligible to compete as an NCAA and institution athlete. A team part of a full time academic institution is fully sponsored by the institution, must have at least six (6) student athletes and more than fifty percent (50%) of the rostered athletes student athletes. The institution's Registrar or other person responsible to do so shall certify to the Commissioner that the rostered players are eligible between December 15 and February 1 of each season.

3. Two Team Proposal: Identify the specific provision that will be changed: Amends Art. I., Sec. 2(a)

State the language of the proposal: In a program with more than one USQRA-member team, players may be transferred from one team to the other at will until rosters for the two teams are set for post-season play December 15. In the event that a player transfers to such a program, the Commissioner shall review the final rosters to ensure the spirit of the transfer up rule is followed.

State the reason the proposal should be passed: This adds the Resolution passed at the 2008 AGM with language to clarify the place of the transfer up rule.
